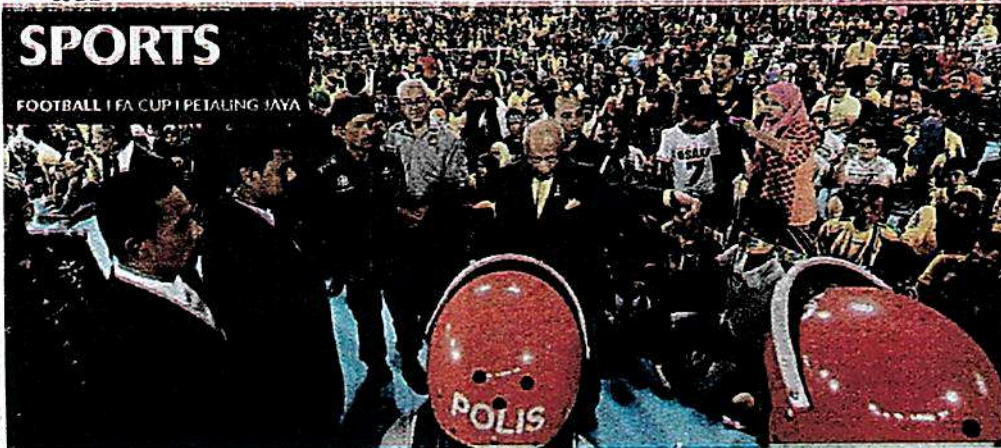

High drama in Kuantan

Pahang v Johor semifinal postponed after fans invade pitch

TEMPERS flared after a security lapse resulted in fans invading the stadium pitch, forcing Johor Darul Takzim FC players to walk off and the FA Cup semifinal second leg between the Southern Tigers and hosts Pahang to be called off yesterday.

The number of fans clearly exceeded Darulmakmur Stadium's 35,000 capacity, raising questions whether certain parties had manipulated ticket sales for the match.

This was acknowledged by FA

of Malaysia (FAM) vice-president cum competitions committee chairman Datuk Hamidin Amin.

"I'll not rule out the possibility of tickets being recycled or a case of forged tickets being sold as Pahang and Darul Takzim FC enjoy a loyal following," Hamidin told *Mailsport* last night.

"I have obtained feedback from the officials at the venue but it is only right if I get the report from both teams. I plan to have a meeting about this matter tomorrow (today) as a decision must be made as soon as possible."

Hamidin admitted delays in kickoffs and the postponement of the match is a "new phenomenon" in Malaysian football that needs to be addressed.

The first leg clash at Larkin Stadium was delayed for about 35 minutes. Darul Takzim won the match 1-0.

Fans, who had travelled the distance, were disappointed with the postponement and vented their frustration on social media sites.

Some claimed that the organisers had oversold tickets while others claimed that a fight broke out at the stands. There were allegations of stones being thrown at opposing fans.

Also, there were those who said the organisers managed to pacify the situation but the Darul Takzim players had trooped out of the field instead.

Among those who were at the

stands were FAM president Sultan Ahmad Shah and FAM assistant general-secretary Datuk Ahmad Fuad Daud.

Pahang coach Dallah Salleh was dumbfounded over the incident.

"I don't know what to say and I'd rather not say anything," said Dallah.

It was learnt that the teams were "advised" not to speak to members of the Press about the incident. It remains unclear when the match will be rescheduled.

Meanwhile, Kelantan managed to book a spot in the FA Cup final after securing a 6-5 aggregate over Terengganu despite losing 4-2 to the Turtles in the semifinal second leg clash in Kuala Terengganu yesterday.

Kobayashi ready for title defence
