'Running tourist' from India comes out tops again

'RUNNING tourist' Sunita Anandgodara, 40, did it again at the Seremban Half Marathon yesterday when she finished first in the women's open category.

A 1992 winner of the Asian Marathon Championship, Sunita beamed when it was confirmed that she had won in the category.

Sunita, who completed the 21km run in one hour, 29 minutes and 39 seconds, said she was on a running tour in Malaysia.

Describing herself as a "running tourist," Sunita said: "I like visiting

this country. It feels even better when you win the race again."

Sunita had already taken part in the Penang Marathon, Kuching International Half Marathon, Sungai Siput 11km Run, Kelantan International 10km Run and the Singapore Half Marathon.

Sunita, a coach for marathon runners, is also an aerobics and yoga instructor in Delhi, India.

Hailed as the Delhi Queen by her friends, Sunita had won more than 20 golds, 10 silver and six bronze from her runs.
